



Your right to minimum work hours





The Australian Government has extended the current minimum hours requirements for short-term PALM scheme workers.

Guaranteed minimum work hours

If you are a short-term PALM scheme worker (working in Australia up to 9 months), your employer must offer you a minimum of 120 hours of work over 4 weeks.

If you are not offered the minimum hours over 4 weeks, your employer must pay your wages equal to 120 hours.

These minimum hours requirements are in place until 31 March 2026.

What do I need to do?

- If you are a new or current PALM scheme worker, you may receive a new offer of employment outlining your minimum work hours. Speak to your employer if you have not received this.
- If you receive your new offer of employment, ask your employer to clearly explain the minimum hours changes to you, and answer any questions you might have.
- If you are a long-term worker (working in Australia for between one and 4 years), you should be offered full-time hours as per the PALM scheme employer guidelines.

What should I do if I still don't understand or am not getting the guaranteed minimum work hours?
